The vets were also very busy at the Small World Farm, where they looked after all of the sick farm animals.

In the construction area the children built many different animal enclosures, farms and even a tractor. The children are continuing to learn new sounds and are gaining confidence in reading week by week. Cursive writing is also progressing nicely among the children. In Maths the children got hands-on learning all about capacity, length and the number 5. Great messy fun was had investigating which containers held more and less water and rice. The children also made long and short snakes out of play doh. In History the children learned all about St Brigid and designed their own version of her magical cloak. In Science the children investigated a daffodil. The children learned about and labelled all

the outer parts of the flower.

In maths children have been learning about the number nine and have been really good at mak-

We went on a lovely Spring walk to identify signs of Spring. Our class have done a lot of work for this years Discovery Primary Science Entry. This month we

focused on technology. We had great fun taking part in Hour of Code and other online Minecraft activities. We have also applied our Maths skills and knowledge by using our online Maths learning platform Zearn.

We had amazing fun in Art while exploring fabric and fibre. We created a 3-D collage of a scarecrow using cloth, wool, straw and string. We also made a collage of an elephant using hessian. Finally, using a wide variety of fabrics we designed an outfit which we would wear.

This month we starting the writing genre of narrative writing. We are really looking forward to this as we love to write stories.
