Junior Infants

What a wonderful start to the year we have had in Junior Infants. The children have been busy getting to know each other and making new friends. The children have been learning all about themselves, their families and their homes. Play is at the centre of everything in the infant classroom and the child led play hour is a firm favourite time of the day. The home corner has been very busy with birthday parties, family dinners and minding the new baby twins. The addition of a new doll house has brought the small world area to life. Water play and washing the babies in sudsy bubble baths has been very popular this week!

The children settle in every morning with some very important fine motor work like threading, beading, lacing and



playdough discos which will all help the children to build up strength in their hands and fingers and write successfully later in the year. Lots of new Irish words have been learned and the children can now say hello and introduce themselves, as well as sing lots of favourite Irish songs such as 'Lámh, Lámh Eile' and 'Rólaí Pólaí'. Maths time is a very busy time of the day in the classroom with lots of matching and sorting games and lovely patterns being made. The children have been learning lots of new nursery rhymes and songs and have created some beautiful art work. Our favourite is our Self-Portraits which are now hanging with pride in our classroom 'WOW WORK' display.

Senior Infants

Senior Infants are off to a great start this year. We had fun with the story 'Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What do you see?' and created beautiful artwork in response to the story. We had a fun and informative workshop with visiting nature teacher Geoff Hunt where we learned about the trees surrounding our school. We gathered samples of leaves from ash trees, mountain ash, spindle, hawthorn and beech trees. We are so lucky to be surrounded by such beautiful countryside and trees. We enjoyed our story time outside. Our Aistear theme is the school office. Children have been engaging very well in the school office for role play, getting into role as the school secretary, the principal, teachers, children and parents. In construction the children have been designing and building their dream school. We have been singing 'When I Was One' and 'Slap the Sillies Out'. In maths we have been learning some number rhymes, 'Five Little Speckled Frogs' and 'Five Little Ducks'. The children did lots of sorting and making sets but especially enjoyed sorting the giant playing cards by number, by colour and by shape. We also learned about the + and = symbols. We are getting very good at reading our sight words. We made beautiful self-portrait drawings using mirrors and were very focused on looking at all the details that make each of us unique.
